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Non-Profit Air and Ground Ambulance Service

MEMBERSHIP OFFER

*You do not have to be eligible for our agency benefits in order to take advantage of this membership. ALL employees are eligible, including part-time and substitute staff.

Mercy Flights is a local non-profit company providing air and ground ambulance service to our community.

- Ground ambulance services to over 2000 square miles
- Helicopter emergency on-scene response within 150 air miles of Medford
- Airplanes provide air ambulance transport as far as 1000 air miles from Medford
- Provides ground and air ambulance service to anyone needing medical transportation in our
 911 service areas
- Emergency medical staff consisting of specially trained Critical Care RNs, Paramedics, EMT's and experienced pilots

Other ambulance services can cost as much as 3 times more than Mercy Flights services. For example, an emergency airplane flight from Crescent City to Medford using another service can cost up to \$60,000. Mercy Flights costs can be as low as \$20,000 for the service.

Benefits of your membership

- Pays 50% of your insurance co-pay
- Pays 50% of the ambulance service bill for qualified members of your household who are uninsured
- Lowers your out-of-pocket cost
- Saves your agency insurance company money, which in turn keeps costs lower for you
